

VADEMECUM 2 – Bibliography database entries How-to - ZGx01 bF

; semicolon at the beginning of the line is a comment (it will be ignored)

; to edit these files the recommended program is Notepad++

; filename is the entry ID (author + year + short title) without spaces, use space + date (ZA000 format)
for old files to be ignored

; begin with the metadata to the publication

AU Author name, author surname; other author name, other author surname; etc

Y year

T title (write it between "" to indicate articles)

T (optional) multi-line title

P (optional) publication

P (optional) multi-line publication

; before summary: @@@@ + site abbreviation (L: Literature, P: Politics, R: Religion, A: Art, Lg: Linguistics)

; use semicolon for multiple site association to the same summary (eg. @@@@L;R;A), if there are other summaries for the same publication use @@@@ again after the summary/notes

@@@@L

SA summary author (abbreviation from "Authorship.txt"); other summary author; etc

SD summary date (day Month year or Month year)

TO (optional) topic; other topic; etc

Here goes the summary (after a new line), every line now is part of the summary (until another @@@@ or @NOTES).

Use two new lines for a new paragraph.

In here you can use [Markdown](<https://github.com/adam-p/markdown-here/wiki/Markdown-Cheatsheet>) and dashes, quotes, ellipses (e.g. *italics*, **bold**, ***italics & bold***, [text](link.htm), ![image text](image.png), <<quotation marks>>, -- en-dash, ... ellipses).

For complex formatting you can use HTML (e.g. 10th, <small>small text</small>).

To reference another entry you can use {B}site/ID_of_the_entry (e.g. {B}R/Abusch2015Gilgamesh).

; notes: @NOTES site/note_number

; if there are other notes use @NOTES again

@NOTES L/1.1

NA note author (abbreviation); other note author; etc

ND note date (day Month year or Month year)

CT (optional) category (used for sorting)

TO (optional) topic; other topic; etc

Here goes the note text (after a new line), it works the same way as the summary.

If the note has here a reference to a bibliography entry (e.g. {B}R/Abusch2015Gilgamesh), the note reference will be automatically added to the bibliography.

VADEMECUM 3 – Bibliographical entry: example

AU here you have to put author's/authors' name + surname (e.g. Buccellati, Giorgio); for multiple authors, use ";" between each author (e.g. Buccellati, Giorgio; Kelly-Buccellati, Marilyn)

Y here goes the date of publication (4 digits: e.g. 2020); if no date is available, please write XXXX

T here goes the title; for monographies, *title* (= italic); for papers, "title"

T (optional) multi-line title

P other data (not mandatory)

P for monographies: place of publication [format: "place: editor" (e.g. Oxford: University Press)] + comma + page(s) [format p(p). 000-000]

for papers: *name of periodic (avoid abbreviations if possible)* + volume number/issue number + + page(s) [format p(p). 000-000]

(e.g. *Zeitschrift für Assyriologie und vorderasiatische Archäologie* 000/0, pp. 000-000)

leave here 2 lines for space

@@@ put the correct code of website (i.e. L: Literature, P: Politics, R: Religion, A: Art, Lg: Linguistics, C: CAR)

SA summary author (abbreviation); other summary author; etc (e.g. gB) (e.g. gB; mDP)

SD month + year (e.g. March 2022)

NR link to themes/review, etc (deprecated: link reference will be automatically generated)

TO topic1; topic2 (separate different topics with a semi-colon)

leave 2 lines for space

Here goes the **summary**.

; NOTES for the summary:

1) use HTML codes for special characters: see <https://www.compart.com/en/unicode/html>

2) for links: [link](name): e.g. [urkesh.org](Urkesh website)

3) for links to DABI files_BIBLIO: {B}site/ID_of_the_entry (e.g. {B}R/Abusch2015Gilgamesh)

4) for links to DABI files_NOTES: {N}site/ID_of_the_entry (e.g. {B}R/1.5)

5) to have spaces between lines, use HTML
 OR add two spaces at the end of a line

6) Use an empty line for a new paragraph. Every paragraph has automatically 4 spaces at the start.

; for further notes on format, check files by bF (on server):

1) 4Banks/_databases/_README_Bibliography&Noted.d

2) 4Banks/_databases/_README_pages.md

VADEMECUM 4 – MID pages (old format HTML <HEAD>)

AU author

D date [month year]

T title

S (optional) subtitle

TO (optional) topic; other topic; etc

HTML (optional) custom template

TOC (optional) custom sidebar ToC for navigation

Here goes the page text (after a new line), every line now is part of the text.

Use an empty line for a new paragraph. Every paragraph has automatically 4 spaces at the start.

Add two spaces at the end of a line to automatically add a
.

In here you can use [Markdown](<https://github.com/adam-p/markdown-here/wiki/Markdown-Cheatsheet>) and dashes, quotes, ellipses (e.g.: *italics* , **bold** , ***italics & bold***, [text](link.htm), !*[image text](image.png), <<quotation marks>>, -- en-dash, ... ellipses).

For complex formatting you can use HTML (e.g.: 10th, <small>small text</small>).

Use [TOC] to generate the table of contents of the current page.

Put attributes in {} to add them to MarkDown elements (e.g. "# Title {#anchor}").

To reference a bibliography entry you can use "{B}site/ID_of_the_entry" (e.g. {B}Mes-rel/Abusch2015Gilgamesh or {B}R/Abusch2015Gilgamesh).

To change the site titles edit the file "_DABI_config.ini".

To change the HTML style edit the file "4banks.css".

To change base HTML and nav edit files in "_templates/"

It is recommended to use the program Notepad++ to edit these files.
