**(v) Campaigns Following the Deification of the King (a) — The Conquest of Settlements in the Ḥabur Basin and the Area of the Headwaters of the Tigris**

(q) The Defeat of Azuḥinnum: *in* 1 M[U] <sup>d</sup>*na-ra-[am-<sup>d</sup>E]*N.ZU REC 169 SUBIR.KI *in a-zu-ḥi-nim.KI i-ša-ru tá-ḥi-ša-ti-li ik-mi-ù* 'The ye[ar] Narā[m-S]în was victorious over Subartum at Azuḥinnum and captured Taḥiš-atili'. AIA 8: Foster, ASJ 4 (1982) p. 23 col. iii–iv. See also Lambert, RA 77 (183) p. 95. Azuḥinnum is also mentioned in E2.1.4.21, an inscription which probably narrates a campaign in the eastern Ḥabur region.

(r) The Construction of a Fortress(?) at Tell Brāk. Recorded in E2.1.4.22.

(s) A Hunting Expedition in the Area of Mount Tibar. Recorded in E2.1.4.23.

(t) The Reaching of the Sources of the Tigris and Euphrates Rivers: [*i*]n 1 MU <sup>d</sup>*na-ra-am-<sup>d</sup>EN.ZU na-gáb* IDIGNA.I, *ù* BURANUN.I, *ik-s[u-dú]* *ù* REC 169<sup>1</sup> [*šè-nam<sup>1</sup>-in-da-[a.KI] [iš<sub>11</sub>]-a-<sup>1</sup>ru*] 'The year Narām-Sîn reached the sources of the Tigris and Euphrates rivers and was victorious in battle over Šenaminda'. (u) A Military Victory in the Area of Modern Pir Hüseyin. Recorded in E2.1.4.24.

(v) A Campaign Against Abarnium: [*i*]n MU REC 448bis LUGAL *in 'à-mar-nu-um i-li-kà-am<sup>†</sup>* 'The year the king went on a campaign in Amarnum'. Umm-el-Jir 1932, 354: Gelb, MAD 5 no. 76.

**(b) The Conquest of Settlements on the Upper Euphrates and in Syria: Ḥaḥḥum, Talḥadum, Eastern Anatolia, the Amanus Mountains (Cedar Forest), Mukiš, Armānum, and Ebla**

(w) The Defeat of Ḥaḥḥum. Alluded to in the Old Babylonian version of the 'Great Revolt' (see Grayson and Sollberger, RA 70 [1976] p. 115 L I 5': [...a]n(?)*-da* LUGAL *ḥa-aḥ-ḥi-i.KI*).

(x) A Campaign Against Talḥadum. Recorded in E2.1.4.25. In this inscription the king's name appears without the prefixed divine determinative. We have assumed that this omission was a mistake of the ancient copyist. If not, the campaign against Talḥadum would date to the period before the deification of the king.

(y) A Trip to the Cedar Forest/Amanus Mountains: [*i*]n 1 [MU] <sup>d</sup>*na-[ra-am-<sup>d</sup>EN.ZU] a-na* GIŠ.TIR ERIN *i-li-[ku]* 'The [year] Na[rām-Sîn] we[nt] to the Cedar Forest. Adab 404 (Istanbul): See Gelb and Kienast, Königsinschriften p. 50 D–7.

(z) [*in* 1 MU <sup>d</sup>*na-ra-am-<sup>d</sup>EN.ZU*]U [REC 169 ...]-*at.KI [...ga]l-at.KI [iš<sub>11</sub>]-a-ru* [*ù šu<sub>4</sub>-ma*] *in* [KUR *a*]*m-na-an* [GIŠ.ERIN] *ib-tú-qam* '[The year Narām-Sîn] was [vic]torious over GN<sub>1</sub> and GN<sub>2</sub> [in battle and personally] cut down [cedar timber] in the [A]manus [Mountains]'.
